



OASIS NC programs provide small group instruction with an emphasis on academic and social skills instruction, compassion for all living beings and character education. Applicants to OASIS NC center based programs must:

- Communicate verbally
- Have no aggressive, self-injurious, or destructive behaviors
 - Use the bathroom independently
- Be able to participate in a small group (not 1-on-1)

STEP 1. Schedule a parent meeting (~30 minutes)

- Tour OASIS NC
- Review programs of interest
- Complete and review application and forms.
- Collect registration fee (\$50) and schedule Student Session 1.

STEP 2: Student Session(s)

- Typically 1-3 sessions (1 hour each)
- \$50/session
- Work with a staff member 1:1 on academic and social tasks to assess present levels, build a rapport, observe work tolerance and endurance, ability to follow directions, and how they handle minor frustrations.

STEP 3: Trial Period

- Costs vary depending on program
- Typically 1-2 weeks
- Join in with peers to assess their group readiness and/or potential

STEP 4: Decision (about 2 weeks after application process is complete)

- Ready: Parents will be given an enrollment packet. Student will be considered enrolled when all paperwork and payments have been submitted.
- Not Ready: Parents will be notified of reason(s) why their child is unable to be enrolled in a program at OASIS NC and given suggestions on how to prepare their child for enrollment.
- Wait List: This means a child is Enrollment Ready, but there isn't space currently available in the group he/she will be joining. An enrollment packet will be given and the child may begin as soon as a space becomes available and all paperwork and payments have been submitted.
